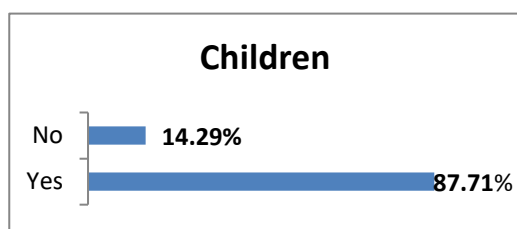
Family

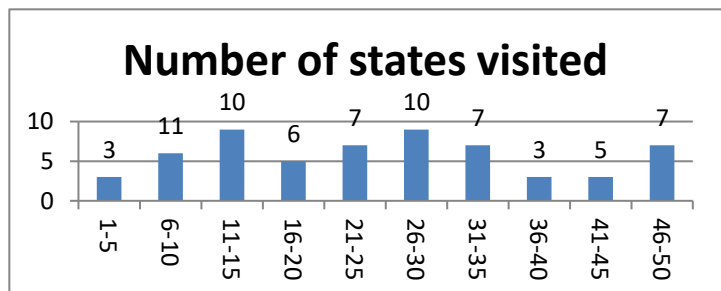

Several of our colleagues have dealt with, or are dealing with, serious health issues. Mike Treiber had open heart triple by-pass surgery. Not only did she have 2 major operations in one week (about 15 total hours) on her back in April of this year, but her husband passed, and her sister's husband had a massive stroke. Belva Perrine-Riley had major back surgery in 1997 and has been affected with Fibromyalgia since then.

Elaine Rosenstock Peizer survived a serious auto accident in which she ran over herself in her driveway, recovering from life-threatening injuries and three hospitalizations/surgeries. Clarice Bailey used drugs, but never went to detox or rehab. She made the decision to stop using on October 29th 37 years ago. She makes "the same decision on a daily basis".

Brenda (Young) Legg dealt with cancer. She said, "I am passionate about life. Since I have had cancer, I thank God for everyday! Life is a challenge and an adventure." Beth Ziegler survived cancer and is now living with Multiple Sclerosis. Our classmate, Barb Evans Godfrey died in January of this year of liver cancer.

Michele (MacConnell) Kurtz lost weight, lowered blood pressure, and feels great after she retired in September 2017 and moved to her retirement home. She remodeled and painted inside and re-landscaped yard all in the last 18 months! She said it didn't help her grow any taller.

Good Works

Giving back and doing good is a common theme in your responses. Just to highlight a few of your good works...

Lynn Olmsted, with a friend, started ReBloom which recycles flowers from Whole Foods and gives them to people at the soup kitchen. She also makes Christmas bags for homeless children in her grandson's school. She crochets hats/scarves for the homeless and baby afghans for the Crisis nursery.

Jim Parker serves on the boards of the Trenton Area Soup Kitchen, New Jersey Policy Perspective, and is the founder of Parker Mother & Child Foundation, a 501 c 3 which gives scholarships to girls in Uganda. He also works as an advocate for NJ Small Business, and for non-profits serving our neighbors in need. He is a partner in CRISPRInsider.com and ImmunoTherapyToday.com. He is politically active and advocates for social policies which benefit all individuals equally.

Katherine Leary Alsdorf works in NYC for a church-related organization that helps people collaborate on projects to serve their city.

Priscilla Featherstone Martin spends her time making quilts, helping people trace their family trees, babysitting preschool age grandkids, and tending graves in the local pioneer cemetery. She is also the organist at her church.

Madeleine Smith said that "Professionally, I am most proud of my work adding prescription drug coverage for seniors under Medicare and for having testified before the U S Senate Finance Committee and for the House Ways & Means Health Subcommittee, both when I worked on healthcare issues for the Congressional Research Service (CRS) which is the research arm for Congress." Now she wants to volunteer in a food bank and work for stricter gun control.

Marti Moore does a lot of volunteer activities, such as serving at her oldest granddaughter's school, participating in Kairos prison ministry, and undertaking various church volunteer efforts.

Carol (Latimer) Williams is a fairly prolific quilter. Most of what she creates is donated to nonprofits such as Hospice and Planned Parenthood.

Jo-Anne (Tiernan) Feldman volunteers at a sanctuary for senior dogs and helps shelter pets get their "forever" homes.

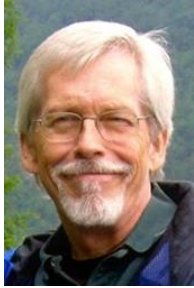
Douglas Lidy (2015)
